Welcome back to the life of busy North Toronto after a wonderful summer.

Since June POINT has facilitated the development of a steering committee who will be preparing a program and operations proposal for a Community Health Centre. The plan is for this Centre to be located in the former 53rd Division Police Station at Montgomery and Yonge. One of the primary focuses in programming will be in providing Daycare for the Frail and Elderly with back-up services. Other possible programs are being developed. Watch future Newsletters for reports on progress of this exciting project.

Last year we explained to you that POINT was bringing new concepts to programming. This was based on recommendations from our long range plan and input from our community advisors, agencies and residents. It has been an exciting year.
