Official Plan, intensification, the Toronto Olympic bid, traffic calming, rent controls, Y2K risks, City of Toronto services and assessments. There was some diversity of opinion on most issues and while the discussion was often lively, differences were treated with respect.

#### **Driver Training Workshop**

POINT and the Toronto Rehabilitation Institute hosted a four hour workshop on March 29, 1999 for volunteer and paid drivers from the Woodgreen Community Centre of Toronto, Red Cross, SPRINT, Mid-Toronto Community Services and St.

Clair West Services for Seniors. This event was the training component of the North Toronto Ride program.

The North Toronto Memorial Community Centre donated space, equipment and parking to the forty-five participants attending. Betty Lou Lynn

representing CTAP

(Community Transportation Action Program) from the provincial ministry showed a video explaining the transportation program as it has been developed in other communities and funded by CTAP.

Following the video, presentations were given by; the Red Cross, 55 Alive, (arranged through the Woodgreen Community Centre), the Canadian Hearing Society and the Toronto Chapter of the Alzheimer Society, (arranged by SPRINT).


Topics covered included defensive driving, driver responsibilities and sensitivity, as well as a demonstration showing how to


> assist the disabled in and out of a vehicle.
