# Senior Transportation is Making Inroads

etting around town isn't always easy. For seniors and people with disabilities, this is especially true. When there are medical appointments and day to day activities to attend to, transportation is often a problem.

Coordinating a transportation service to meet client needs is difficult, even at the best of times. However, when the demand for transportation exceeds the number of vehicles and drivers available, scheduling rides can become a nightmare.

North Toronto Ride, a pilot project funded by CTAP (Community Transportation Action Program) has been estab-



lished to examine more effective ways of coordinating the transportation service for both providers and consumers. SPRINT is the Funding Sponsor and is working with

POINT, the Anne Johnston Health Station, North Toronto Memorial Community Centre, Toronto Ambulance, Red Cross, Toronto Rehabilitation Institute, St. Clair West Services for Seniors, Burt Transport Ltd., and Wheel Trans to find ways to provide more rides to more people.

The participating agencies hope to share existing resources, like their vehicles, staff, and databases to better meet the transportation demand.
