POINT Student Volunteer Resource Guide

POINT has recently developed a new resource to assist youth in the North Toronto area entitled "The Student Volunteer Resource Guide". As you may be aware, in 1999 the Ministry of Education announced that every secondary school student entering grade nine is now required to complete 40 hours of community

involvement in order to receive an Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD).

In order to aid North Toronto students in meeting this requirement, POINT has produced "The Student Volunteer Resource Guide". The purpose

of the guide is to provide a resource specifically designed for high school students in North Toronto. This guide lists volunteer opportunities with many agencies/organizations in North Toronto and some agencies/organizations in the City of Toronto that are looking for youth to volunteer. Also, a list of contact telephone numbers and addresses for those organizations is included, along with information on volunteer responsibilities and rights, the volunteer interview and on-line volunteer resources.

The resource guide has been

distributed to 22 high schools in the local community, including the public, private, and separate school systems, and POINT has received very positive initial feedback from students, guidance counsellors, and school principals.

As your neighbourhood information service, we can POINT you in the right direction!

- Q My landlord gave me a letter, informing me about an upcoming rent increase in 30 days. The letter states that I will be required to pay a 10% rent increase; this is much more than I can afford. I approached my landlord with my concern; he told me I have been living in my apartment for almost one year now and that is the basis on which he has decided to increase my rent.
- A If your landlord did not apply to the Ontario Rental Housing Tribunal for permission to raise your rent, your rent increase is therefore il-legal. According to the Tenant protection Act, your landlord can only raise your rent by the annual guideline once every 12 months; he is also obligated to give you written notice at least 90 days before the increase is scheduled to begin.
