#### COMMUNITY RESOURCES

- Q: I recently received a letter from my landlord about an upcoming rent increase of 8%. This is much more than I can afford. Whom can I turn to to find out if this is legal, and get some help in fighting this? Thank you.
- A: Your landlord can increase your rent no more than once every 12 months either from the date of the previous rent increase or 12 months after you move in. Your landlord must give you written notice of any rent increase at least 90 days before your rent goes up. If you do not get a written notice, you do not have to pay a rent increase. (One exception to this rule: if you have signed an agreement to pay more in exchange for new services or improvements, then no notice is required. Sections 126 and 127 of the TPA.) In 2006, the rent guideline is 2.1%. The rent guideline for 2007 will be 2.6%. Landlords can, in some cases, apply to the Tribunal for an increase, which is higher than the annual guideline, such as in your situation. This should be given to tenants in the Notice of Rent Increase form (form N1). If your landlord did not apply to get permission to raise your rent, your rent increase above the guideline is
