## 10<sup>TH</sup> ANNUAL NORTH TORONTO COMMUNITY FAIR

## North Toronto All Candidates Meeting

POINT held an All Candidates Meeting on Sunday, September 30, 2007 at the North Toronto Memorial Community Centre.

This meeting offered an opportunity for local residents to engage in the electoral process, and learn about the political views of the candidates who were running in the provincial election for the Eglinton-Lawrence riding.

POINT also invited Brigitte Nowak, a Referendum Resource Officer from Elections Ontario to give a presentation on the Mixed Member Proportional Referendum which community members had to vote for or against on election day.

The event was well attended by the community and was chaired by Michael Muller. Michael Muller is a professor of Architecture at Sheridan College and has lived in North Toronto for over 30 years. He was deeply involved with POINT in the design and construction of the North Toronto Memorial Community Centre.

### Q & A

**Q:** Can POINT help me get a job?

**A:** POINT is a community information and referral service; we are not a formal employment service agency. We are aware however, of many organizations throughout Toronto that offer general services such as: resume writing, interview skills, job search skills, etc. As well, POINT is aware of a number of employment-based agencies that serve specific groups like older adults, women, various disabilities, specific languages, youth, hard-to-reach, etc. So as your local community information centre, we can direct you to agencies that best suit your needs.

Having said that, POINT recently began offering up to a six week *Job Finding* workshop series specifically for newcomers. These workshops, currently being offered on Saturday mornings, cover getting to know many websites that have job postings, as well as learning different techniques for resumes and interviews. Also, POINT offers a free one-on-one resume critique clinic, by appointment only.

POINT does have a job bulletin board where organizations and companies send us job postings regularly. We also have an "Employment Training Binder" that lists many workshops throughout the city related to aspects of the job search. Also, POINT's website has a Programs & Services web page; on this page is a Job Links section leading you to the type of services outlined in the above paragraph.

## A Tribute to Joan Osler



On June 21, 2007, POINT honoured Joan Osler for 35 years of outstanding volunteer service and community leadership in North Toronto at a celebration dinner held at the Toronto Cricket Skating and Curling Club. This was the second event organized by POINT to honour an exceptional contributor to the life of North Toronto

and to sustain "The Anne Johnston Fund" (est. 2004) to support POINT's work. In conjunction with the establishment of this fund, POINT decided to recognize persons who have made an outstanding contribution to the life of North Toronto. Anne Johnston was selected as the first recipient of this distinction in 2004 and Joan Osler was the second honoree this past June.

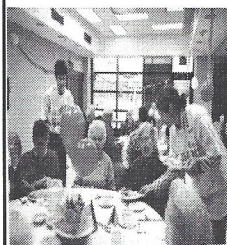
Joan Osler has worked to improve North Toronto life in many sectors, with some of her most recognizable work coming during her 26-years as Executive Director of POINT. During that time, she joined with a team of dedicated volunteers and worked tirelessly to turn North Toronto from an under-served community to a flourishing neighbourhood with plenty of programs for local residents. "When I joined in 1972, there were no services for people of any age in North Toronto,...we managed to get a community centre in North Toronto (North Toronto Memorial Community Centre), the Anne Johnston Health Centre and saw the start of groups like SPRINT (Seniors Peoples Resources in North Toronto) and HINTS (Housing in North Toronto for Seniors).

While her impact is obvious throughout North Toronto, her proudest achievement resonates in schools across Ontario. She was one of five founding members of Prologue to Performing Arts, an organization that has brought professional dancers, musicians and other performers into schools to share their craft with students. "One thing I was concerned about was that the only children going to the theatre were children from wealthy families. I wanted to ensure that all children had that opportunity".

She has also given freely of her time to the Canadian Opera Company, the Canadian National Institute for the Blind, Sistering, the Junior League of Toronto, the North Toronto Hockey Association and a number of other local organizations.

Joan currently remains an active member within the community by continuing to give her time to notable worthy community programs.

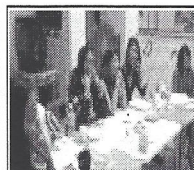
