Honouring Charlotte Maher "One of North Toronto's Finest"

At the third Anne Johnston Event, P.O.I.N.T. Inc. (People and Organizations in North Toronto) is thanking Charlotte Maher for more than 40 years of service to her community of North Toronto and to the City of Toronto by holding a luncheon in her honour.

The "Anne Johnston Event" is held to recognize an extraordinary contribution to this community by a North Toronto resident. The two previous distinguished honourees are Anne Johnston, for whom the event is named, and Joan Osler. Anne Johnston was a founder of P.O.I.N.T. Inc. and its second chair. As a Councillor for many years with both the City of Toronto and Metro Council, Anne worked tirelessly for our community of North Toronto. Joan Osler served as Executive Director of P.O.I.N.T. for 26 years as well as serving in many volunteer capacities within both North Toronte and our City. Both former recipients are delighted to have Charlotte join their illustrious ranks.

Charlotte has resided in North Toronto, in the same house behind Northern Secondary School, since 1969 and, at 83, she remains a strong pillar of our community. We are extremely grateful that she chose North Toronto as her home base.

Within our North Toronto community, Charlotte was instrumental in the founding of P.O.I.N.T., S.P.R.I.N.T. (Senior Peoples' Resources in North Toronto), Central Eglinton Community Centre, the Upper Yonge Village Day Care, and the Sherwood Park Residents' Association and her interest in the activities of these organizations continues to this day. She also contributed to the development of the North Toronto Memorial Community Centre by chairing the Needs Assessment Committee.

With her Masters in Social Work from Boston University and an Advanced Diploma in Social Work from the University of Toronto, along with her incredible adaptability and excellent problem solving skills, Charlotte has served no less than 48 times as interim executive director for a myriad of social service agencies. This, in total, is an incredible achievement, as well as a full time – and counting – career.

Charlotte served as a Trustee on the Toronto Board of Education for eight years and ran (unsuccessfully) for City Council against both Michael Walker and June Rowlands. In her honour, a lovely shady park on Roehampton Avenue became "Charlotte Maher Park" in 2001.

A valued member of many Boards of Directors in North Toronto and elsewhere, Charlotte went on to become the Chair of many of these Boards—extensive responsibilities that speak volumes about her knowledge, commitment and reliability. As well, countless task forces, steering committees, strategic planning committees, working groups, conference steering committees and integration projects have benefited from her dynamism, wisdom and experience.

Currently, Charlotte serves as a Director of Care Watch, an organization that advocates preventive care funding for seniors to allow them to live independently in their own homes — funding for such things as help with housework, meals, and some health care needs, and serves as its Treasurer.

Thank you, Charlotte, for all the wonderful work you have done – and still do – to improve the lives of all of us who reside and/or work and/or go to school in both our community and other communities in our City of Toronto.


